## Stonehead Cabbage





## Brassica oleracea 'Stonehead'

- <u>Use</u>: Tightly packed heads are short-cored and average 4- to 6- lbs. Won't burst. Resistant to black rot and Fusarium yellows.
- <u>Exposure/Soil</u>: Full to part sun. They must have well-drained soils, so if you have red clay you must amend it. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry.
- <u>Growth</u>: Grows 12" tall and wide. Recommended spacing is 12 to 15 inches on rows at least three feet apart. You can also increase production in small garden by planting a double row on a bed.
- <u>Hardiness</u>: Vegetable; Can be planted in spring, summer, or fall.
- <u>Foliage</u>: Named for its solid head, Stonehead holds well in the garden without splitting, so there is no need to hurry the harvest. Head shape is round.
- Flower: Not known for flowers.
