Flash Collards



An excellent cutting green with a mild, sweet flavor especially if exposed to a little frost.

High in iron, calcium, potassium, phosphorus, and vitamins A, B, C, and E. Rapid regrowth after harvest.

- <u>Use</u>: Vates-type hybrid. Collards are wonderfully tolerant of both heat and cold; in fact, their flavor is sweetened by a little frost.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full to part sun. Prefer a fertile, well-drained soil high in organic matter with a pH range of 6.0–7.5. Consistent moisture will produce the best quality leaves. Must amend red clay for best crop.
- **Growth**: Plants reach 16-23 inches tall. 80 days.
- <u>Hardiness</u>: Vegetable; Can be planted in spring or fall.
- *Foliage:* Very slow to bolt. Flash offers repeated harvests of dark green, smooth leaves. Very high yielding.
- Flower: Not known for flowers.
