- <u>Use</u>: Fill your garden with a healthy snack for lunchtime and beyond.
 These sweet orange snacking peppers serve both loads of crunch
 and lots of beta-carotene and vitamin C. They're ideal for eating
 straight off the plant, chopped fresh in salads, or sliced thin for stirfries. Plants tend to give high yields, so consider staking with a tomato cage when planting in a windy location, to keep stems from
 breaking.
- <u>Exposure/Soil</u>: Full sun or at least 5-6 hours of afternoon sun. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry. Use slow release fertilizer for best results. Keep water off leaves and flowers.
- Growth: Grows 1-2' tall and 1-1.5' wide.
- *Hardiness:* Zone 9-11, annual, houseplant.
- Foliage: Small, lacy leaves.
- Flower/Fruit: These beautiful, mini-sized peppers are delicious sautéed, as an addition to salads and, perfect for a healthy snack. Smooth, bright orange fruits average 2 1/2-3" long by 1 1/2" wide.
