## Ficus carica 'LSU Purple Fig'

- <u>Use</u>: Grow glossy purple fruit, enjoyed fresh or dried! Fruit is mediumsized with a mild flavor, high sugar content, and white flesh. The pulp is light amber to light red when ripe. Highly productive. Pest- and diseaseresistant. Louisiana State University introduction. Grows well in containers! Heat-tolerant. Ripens from July through frost. Self-pollinating. *Please be* sure to read the Home Garden Figs article from UGA on our Plant Information Page on the website.
- <u>Exposure/Soil</u>: Grow in full sun. Well-drained, rich soil. pH of 5.5 to 6.5 necessary.
- <u>Growth</u>: Approximately 8 10' tall x 8 10' wide. Plant 10-15' apart.
  Tree is a vigorous, upright grower.
- *Hardiness:* 6-10; Tree.
- Foliage: Deciduous. Do not prune mature trees heavily because this can reduce the crop.
- Flower/ Fruit: . Fruit are medium in size, purple skin color, reddish pulp, and a good flavor. Plants are very prolific bearing sooner than most figs and also bearing to times a year. Recommended for fresh eating and preserves.
