Mortgage Lifter Tomato





Heirlooms have all the flavor that store tomatoes lack.

• Lycopersicum 'Mortgage Lifter''

- <u>Use</u>: This huge heirloom beefsteak (up to 4 lb.; average 2½ lb.) consistently wins taste-tests. Developed in the 1930s by a gardener who planted the four biggest varieties he knew and crossed one with pollen from the other three. He did this for six seasons and created a variety that produced immense, tasty fruit. He sold the plants for \$1 a piece and paid off his \$6000 mortgage in 6 years. Hence the name.
- **<u>Exposure/Soil</u>**: FULL SUN! Soak to depth of 6 to 10 inches when watering. They need at least 6 hours of direct sunlight a day. Tomatoes hate red clay so use a good soil such as our peat mix.
- <u>Growth</u>: Grows 36" tall and 36" wide or more depending on type. Plant tomatoes 2"-3" deeper than current soil line for a sturdy plant.
- *Hardiness:* 9-11, annual, houseplant. 80 days from seed to ripen.
- *Foliage:* Small, lacy leaves.
- *Fruit*: Indeterminate; The large, slightly flattened, pink-red fruits that range from 1 pound to more than 3 pounds, are meaty, very flavorful and have few tomato seeds.
