Hardier than the Wonderful and known to survive temperatures down to 5 degrees. Self-pollinated.



## Punica grantum 'Salavatski'

- <u>Use</u>: One of the most cold and heat tolerant Pomegranates. Experiences no damage from freeze damage down to 3 degrees F!
- <u>Exposure/Soil</u>: Full to part sun. Soil should be well-drained.
   Acidic soil is preferred, though it can tolerate a wide variety of soils. As long as it is properly established, it is moderately drought tolerant.
- **Growth:** Growing up to 10 feet tall and wide with a naturally rounded shape. It can be grown as a large shrub or "limbed up' to form a small tree.
- Hardiness: Zone 7-10; Tree/ Small shrub
- Foliage: Deciduous. Small green leaves.
- **Flower:** The fruits as large as the store-bought "Wonderful" variety, and are orange-red in skin and red arils. Like "Wonderful" it is a hard seeded variety. Please google "UGA Pomegranate" for an excellent article on care.
