Archer's Gold Creeping Thyme





Great along walkways or between stepping stones especially in dry locations as they need good drainage.



Thymus citriodorus 'Archer's Gold'

- <u>Use:</u> Attractive, fragrant, and flavorful, it combines good looks with delightful lemony scent and flavor. In summer, the low-growing gold -and-green foliage is covered with pale purple flowers abuzz with pollinators. Planted as an edging along walkways or between stepping stones, this tough plant will tolerate light foot traffic and release a citrus aroma with every step. Or, plant in a kitchen garden or container so you can snip a sprig or two to enliven culinary creations.
- Exposure/Soil: Tolerates full sun to part shade. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry to start. Little water needed once established.
- **Growth:** Moderate grower 4-6" tall x 6-12" wide and continues to spread by underground shoots.
- *Hardiness:* Zone 5-9, Perennial
- <u>Foliage</u>: Evergreen. Small, golden leaves with an aromatic, lemon scent
- **Flower:** Blooms in early to mid-spring with loads of light lavender flowers attracting butterflies.
