Vaccinium ashei 'Ochlockonee'

- <u>Use:</u> Part of the Georgia River Series Ochlockonee is a 2002 release of the University of Georgia . Fruit ripens late June through mid August producing excellent yields. It has good berry color, firmness and a dry picking scar. Plant growth habit is very vigorous and upright. Suggested pollinators are Brightwell and Powderblue.
- **<u>Exposure/Soil</u>**: Prefers light, acid soils (pH 4.5-5.2) with high organic matter (20-50%) are preferred, unlike most fruit crops.
- *Growth:* Moderate, 4-10' tall and wide; best if pruned.
- Hardiness: Zone 6-9; shrub
- <u>Pollination</u>: <u>Plant more than one variety for cross-pollination to</u> promote adequate fruit set. Also, choosing varieties from the different ripening categories provides a broad harvest season.
- *Foliage:* Deciduous. Bluish-green foliage.
- <u>Flower</u>: Berries are blue-black color; good fruit quality. Fruit mature in about 90 days from bloom. Chilling requirement is 600 to 650 hours. *More info from UGA on our website on the PLANT INFOR-MATION PAGE*.
