
Savanna Haworthia

Haworthia 'Savanna'

- <u>Use:</u> This pale green succulent has a classic rosette silhouette looks great in any space! Haworthias are native to South Africa and have about 80 species and many hundreds of cultivars in the genre. These South African natives are widely collected with some of the variegated cultivars fetching hundred and occasionally thousands of dollars. This plant is a slow-growing succulent producing clumps of small rosettes of fleshy, tiny green leaves.
- <u>Exposure/Soil</u>: Sunny windows to high indirect light shade indoors in a
 well-drained soil and irrigate regularly to occasionally in spring and summer.
 like other succulents, do not need too much water in fact, you can easily
 accidentally kill a Haworthia by overwatering. It's therefore important to
 make sure that it is allowed to dry out completely between waterings.
- **Growth:** Slow growth to 2". Haworthias are clump-forming plants that produce offsets, also known as 'pups'. These baby plants can be split off when they reach about a third of the size of the parent plant.
- <u>Hardiness</u>: Zone 9-11; Annual/ Houseplant
- *Foliage:* Upright, ghost green, lance-shaped leaves with sharp tips and bumps adorning them.
- **Flower:** Prepare for an extremely long flower stem and underwhelming bloom. Flowers are usually white to pale pink.
