Kangaroo Fern Basket



This plant filters pollutants from the air while releasing oxygen. With this plant in your home, you breathe cleaner air.

This plant is considered non-toxic, therefore safe around children and pets.

- <u>Use</u>: If you are looking to add a plant with a lush, tropical vibe to your houseplant collection, look no further than the kangaroo fern. This fern has the "rainforest look" mastered! Plus, they are easy to care for, especially when compared to some other fussier fern species.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Part sun-shade if outdoors in warmer months above 50 degrees. Bright indirect light indoors. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry. Use slow release fertilizer for best results. Ferns love humidity. Just be sure to water in the mornings if possible. Water under the leaves as they hate being watered in the center of the plant. Grows best in an environment with high to moderate humidity, which makes it an excellent bathroom plant.
- <u>Growth:</u> Will continue to grow in the basket, but not very fast to about 12-24" tall.
- <u>Hardiness</u>: Zone 9-11, Annual, Houseplant, Bring inside in winter and keep above 50 degrees.
- **Foliage:** Graceful arching leaves are not feathery like some other species of ferns. Instead, they are "chunky," and some say, shaped like a kangaroo paw, hence its common name. Each frond varies slightly in appearance, with some producing extended "toes" that reach out beyond the rest of the frond.
- Flower: No flowers, instead ferns have spores on the bottom of leaves.
