A great groundcover for shady areas.Ajuga tenorii Princess Nadia is tight like a cushion. It never becomes invasive like other varieties of Ajuga. Ideal for mass plantations, mixed containers, specimen, flowering borders or ribbon plantations.

- <u>Use:</u> Gorgeous, cream-purple foliage with glowing pink edges becomes covered in royal blue flower spikes in spring, often lightly repeating in late summer. This unique perennial forms a tight, cushion-like clump; does not invade as common Ajuga can. Ideal for mass planting as groundcover or border edging, or for contrast in mixed containers. A vigorous ground cover suppresses weeds.
- <u>Exposure/Soil</u>: Prefers morning sun and afternoon shade or all day filtered sun/ shade. Use slow release or water soluble fertilizer. Keep soil moist watering under leaves and flowers for best results.
- **Growth:** Forms a dense clump, 2 to 3 in. tall, slowly spreading 24 in. wide.
- *Hardiness:* Zone 4-9 perennial.
- **Foliage:** Semi-evergreen. In spring, cream-purple foliage with glowing pink edges appear.
- **Flower:** In late spring, the biggest surprise are the royal blue flower spikes that emerge. Not just one, but a lot of them! As a bonus it reblooms in late summer with several flower spikes.
