
Chantilly Lace Goat's Beard





Aruncus hybrid 'Chantilly Lace'

- <u>Use:</u> A part-shade loving perennial that produces beautiful sprays of lacy, cream-colored flowers. A similar look to Astilbe, but more drought tolerant. Use for shady rock gardens. Though Aruncus tends to be a slowgrower the first couple of seasons, once it is established it puts on a fabulous show year after year. Make sure it has plenty of room to grow when you first plant it; transplanting this species is a very difficult task. This species is native to North America. Deer resistant!
- <u>Exposure/Soil</u>: <u>Prefers afternoon shade</u>. Use slow release or water soluble fertilizer. Prefers to be kept moist and likes rich soil. Keep soil moist watering under leaves and flowers for best results. Drought tolerant once established. This is a good replacement for Astilbes in drier areas.
- Growth: Grows 30-32" tall and wide
- <u>Hardiness</u>: Zone 3-7b; Perennial. Mulch around plant in the winter. Make sure they have well drained soil in the winter. If in too much sun it will suffer in summer.
- *Foliage:* Deciduous. Fabulous orange to red fall foliage color!
- <u>Flower:</u> Creamy white panicles float above the light green, deeply-cut foliage. This gives the feel if a lacy fern with the added bonus of a bloom.
