Digitali purpurea 'Dalmation Purple'

- <u>Use:</u> Superb in borders, beds, and open woodland gardens. More compact growing than most foxgloves on the market. Does not require over wintering to bloom. Attracts hummingbirds. Deer and rabbit resistant.
- <u>Exposure/Soil</u>: Part sun- part shade, very easy to please. Provide acidic (most GA soil already is), well-drained, moist soil, but not soggy. Use a slow release fertilizer.
- **Growth:** Grows quickly 2-4' tall or more and 18" wide
- <u>Hardiness</u>: 5-9; Perennial; reseeding biennial/ perennial; Make sure that heavy mulch is removed around the plants to allow seeds to drop and sprout.
- Foliage: Soft, fuzzy leaves.
- <u>Flower:</u> Colorful, prolific, and long-blooming, A strong, compact, and reliable show-stealer in the early-summer garden. Big blooms of come in white or purple. (Labeled on pot by color.) Deadhead first-year blooms by trimming back the spent flower stems to base of the plant, to encourage overwintering and a second year of bloom.
