- <u>Use:</u> This hybrid perennial foxglove originated in 1926. A winning hybrid
 of pink D. purpurea and yellow D. grandiflora, 'Summer King' has ample
 spires of crushed strawberry red flowers, a neat, compact form, and handsome foliage Many foxglove species are a reliably good source of nectar
 for bumblebees, especially long-tongued bumblebees. Not for human or
 animal consumption.
- <u>Exposure/Soil</u>: Part sun– part shade, very easy to please. Provide acidic (most GA soil already is), well-drained, moist soil, but not soggy. Use a slow release fertilizer.
- Growth: Grows quickly 3' tall or more and 18" wide. At flowering time, plants may need to be staked.
- <u>Hardiness</u>: Zone 5-9; Reseeding biennial/ perennial; Make sure that heavy mulch is removed around the plants to allow seeds to drop and sprout.
- <u>Foliage</u>: Deciduous. Plants form a low rosette of coarse, hairy leaves in the first year, bursting into flower the second spring, then setting seed and usually dying.
- **Flower:** Spikes are densely packed with large bells in a stunning crushed strawberry shade.
