Remote Wood Fern







Semi-evergreen, shadeloving, and deer resistant

Dryopteris remota

- <u>Use:</u> AKA the scaly buckler fern, is a fertile hybrid between Dryopteris affinis and Dryopteris expansa. It displays some of the finer characteristics of each parent from the crown's golden scales inherited from D. affinis to the fine textured light green foliage of D. expansa. It is one of the earliest ferns to appear in the spring bringing joy to the winter weary garden and gardener. Horizontally arching.
- <u>Exposure/Soil</u>: Part shade—shade. Acid, moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Use slow release fertilizer two times a year.
- <u>Growth</u>: The fronds are 30-48" tall and wide. Creeping, branching, forming clumps. Slow to moderate growth rate.
- Hardiness: Zone 4-8 Perennial
- <u>Foliage</u>: Evergreen. The lacy light green shaggy foliage adorns the gold-scaled stipe (fern stem).
- Flower: none
