
Bevan's Variety Geranium

- <u>Use:</u> Deep magenta blooms with contrasting red sepals late spring to early summer. Spreading/mounding habit makes it a good ground cover candidate. From Must Have Perennials®. Hardy geraniums are wonderful filler plants for any landscape, either residential or commercial. They blend nicely with most other perennials and offer continuous color throughout the summer months.
- <u>Exposure/Soil</u>: Prefers full sun area with some shade in the afternoon. For best results, plant in a dry to moist area in a well-drained site. Drought tolerant once established
- <u>Growth:</u> Grows 10" tall and 18" wide initially, but will spread (non-invasive). Leave plenty of room to grow this wide spreading perennial. In one season, one vigorous plant will cover a 2-3 sq. foot area.
- *Hardiness:* Zone 4-8; Perennial
- Foliage: Deciduous; Deeply lobed and rounded, grayish-green leaves (4-8" long) have 5-7 lobes, with each lobe having 3 to 5 notches at the tip. Leaves are strongly aromatic when crushed. Leaves acquire attractive red tones in autumn.
- <u>Flower:</u> Long-lasting purple-pink flowers (to 1" wide) with inflated dark red calyces bloom in umbel-like clusters above the foliage in late spring to early summer, often with some sporadic rebloom occurring throughout summer.
