Geum will grow anywhere that isn't full shade or in a puddle. Why are they not more popular then? I'll tell you my theory; when they are grown in pots they are very straggly and don't look great! The reality is that when planted in the ground they will be much more compact, bushy, and upright.

- <u>Use:</u> The new Tempo series offers longer bloom time, gorgeous flower colors, and strong foliage. These are new to market in 2024! You will love growing Geums because they're so EASY, bloom Spring thru Fall, attract pollinators like bees and butterflies, and make excellent cut flowers. Great in the border, but most effective when planted in a grouping. Vigorous, compact and long blooming. Rabbit and deer resistant.
- Exposure/Soil: Full to part sun preferred. Provide well-drained, moist soil, but not soggy. Use a slow release fertilizer. Remove faded flowers regularly to encourage more buds. Plants may be pruned back hard after blooming, to rejuvenate the foliage. Deadhead regularly and provide low water for best flower too much water and you'll end up with only foliage!
- Growth: Grows 15" tall and 16" wide.
- *Hardiness*: Zone 5-10 Perennial. Reseeds
- **Foliage:** Semi-evergreen. Plants form a low clump of coarse green leaves, with branching stems held above bearing medium-sized rounded flowers.
- <u>Flower:</u> Large, 2" muted orange flowers shift to a soft peachy-taupe color and then drop petals neatly. Flowers may be single or double. Very long bloom time starting in February in Georgia and then repeating until fall.
