2001 Perennial Plant of the Year! Low Maintenance and drought tolerant!

- <u>Use:</u> This reed grass is a vertical masterpiece and provides wonderful contrast amongst low shrubs and perennials. Often used in naturalized areas, its ultimate size is directly related to the amount of moisture. Even though Calamagrostis can grow in fresh-water bogs, it also thrives in drier areas. Sways gracefully in the lightest breeze. A row or a mass planting of Karl is spectacular on a windy day! Deer resistant!
- <u>Exposure/Soil</u>: Full sun; moist to wet fertile soil; tolerates a wide range of soil types including dry sandy soil; thrives in clay soil.
- **Growth:** Grows 5 to 6 feet tall, with flowers 7 to 8 feet tall.
- <u>Hardiness</u>: 4-9, Perennial
- Foliage: Deciduous. Foliage is green; medium blade width; 36-48" tall. Cut back in February to 1' tall.
- <u>Flower:</u> Feathery loose purple tinged flowers on stalks to 6 feet tall in summer that age to a buff color by late summer. Flowers often remain erect despite heavy snowfall.
