Pumpkin Spice Foamy Bells



Heucherella is a hybrid genus produced from a cross between Heuchera and Tiarella. From Heuchera they gain the many different foliage colors and textures, while Tiarella add deeper leaf lobes and serration, as well as their signature central leaf blotching. Heucherella are sterile hybrids, and so typically have longer bloom seasons than either of their parents.

- <u>Use:</u> Get a sweet taste of fall in spring with 'Pumpkin Spice'! Bronze red leaves emerge in late spring and hold its color well into early summer. Each 4" lobed leaf has deep mahogany centers that follow the veins of the leaf. Dark red stems hold cream flowers that appear in early summer. For best foliage color and performance, plant in an area with filtered sun or afternoon shade. 'Pumpkin Spice' is a H. villosa hybrid which means that it is naturally more heat and humidity tolerant and also has greater vigor than Heucherellas without such parentage. It forms a very dense mound of interesting foliage that is evergreen in most climates.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Part sun-shade. Best when planted under other trees, but not too deep a shade or poor flowering and leaf color. Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Use slow release fertilizer two times a year. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry.
- Growth: Fast growth to 8-10" tall, 16-20" in bloom overall, by 18-22" wide.
- Hardiness: Zone 4-9; Perennial
- <u>Foliage</u>: Semi-evergreen. Bronze-orange lobed foliage with leaf veins traced in mahogany red.
- <u>Flower</u>: Small creamy-white blooms dangle above the foliage in late spring and early summer.
