Pink Rock Candy Bearded Tounge/ Penstemon



Sweet as candy, but tough as nails. Lovely as a cut flower and long blooming too. Fits well at the front of a border, along walkways and in containers.



Penstemon 'Pink Rock Candy'

- <u>Use</u>: A tidy, compact clump of green foliage topped by upright spikes full of bright pink, bell-shaped flowers that will provide mouth-watering color in the landscape or a container. Blooms heavily in late spring, reblooming in late summer if lightly trimmed after the first flush. Heat and drought tolerant.
- <u>Exposure/Soil</u>: Prefers full sun or at least 5-6 hours of afternoon sun. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry.
 Drought tolerant once established.
- **Growth:** Moderate growing; reaches 12 to 18 in. tall and wide.
- *Hardiness:* Zone 6-9; Perennial
- Foliage: Deciduous. Thin, dark green leaves.
- <u>Flower:</u> With head-turning color, this early to midsummer bloomer puts Penstemon into the spotlight. Bred for compact growth capped by spires of cerise-pink flowers, this little beauty accents containers as well as the edge of a border.
