
Appalacian Mountain Mint

Pycnanthemum flexuosum

• <u>Use</u>: The mountain mints are listed on many "Top Ten Plants for Pollinators" lists. A member of the mint family, the aromatic oils in the foliage make Pycnanthemum very deer and rabbit resistant. Mountain mint contains pulegone which is a natural insect repellant. It is a larval host plant for the Gray Hairstreak Butterfly and the flowers are covered in wasps, bees, flies, butterflies, and skippers as it blooms throughout the summer. Good to incorporate along the perennial border, rain garden, or near the vegetable garden to entice pollinators and best planted in large clumps where insects can easily move from flower to flower. The strong root systems make a tough soil stabilizer that is great for slopes and streambanks.

- <u>Exposure/Soil</u>: Full to part sun. Happiest in wet shade. Native to bogs, wet meadows, and open woodlands throughout most of the eastern United States so very adaptable.
- <u>*Growth*</u>: Typically growing to a height of 2-3', it can grow larger, up to 4'. It will begin blooming when the plant reaches a width of approximately 1' wide.
- Hardiness: Zone 6-9 Perennial
- *Foliage:* Deciduous. Aromatic leaves are arranged opposite from each other on short petioles along the stemsFoliage develops an attractive red tinge in autumn.
- <u>Flower:</u> Blooming lasts for about 6 weeks from mid-summer to early autumn. The florets mature into ovoid nutlets that are nestled into brown button-like cymes. Loved as a fragrant element in cut flower bouquets.
