A wonderfully unique addition to sunny garden beds, adding late-season color. Waterwise, easy-care, and loved by pollinators.

- <u>Use:</u> Very large, dense heads of light purple buds contrast with the dark violet-purple flowers on a shorter, sturdier form than other varieties (like 'Brillant'). Upright habit and short stature. Won an Award of Garden Merit from the RHS in 2006. A winner in the garden and in the beds! Excellent in the landscape, rock garden and container plantings; makes a great groundcover. Particularly impactful in front of grasses. Prefers dry, well-drained soil in full sun. Deer resistant, drought tolerant, and attracts butterflies!
- <u>Exposure/Soil</u>: Plant in full sun. Prefers well-drained soil, but It will tolerate most soil types and is drought resistant.
- Growth: Grows 15" tall and 17" wide.
- *Hardiness:* Zone 4-9; Perennial
- Foliage: Deciduous. Dusty green foliage.
- Flower: Strongly contrasting colors between its light buds and dark mauve flowers. Can also be sued as a cut flower. The showy flower heads reach their peak in fall, and if left standing will provide winter interest and food for birds.
