Sea Urchin Sedum





Drought tolerant and so easy to grow! An excellent groundcover!





Sedum lineare 'Sea Urchin'

- <u>Use:</u> Rock gardens, borders, edging, under shady trees and steep banks will come alive with carefree groundcover. They fill troublesome areas with neat 2" tall cover. Spreads fast. Does not need pruning. Tolerant of dry infertile soils and is useful for covering difficult places and providing erosion control on banks.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Will tolerate full sun or shade (less white on leaf) in well-drained soil. It will tolerate most soil types and is drought resistant.
- **Growth**: Grows 2-4" tall and 24" wide.
- Hardiness: Zone 7a-9a; Perennial
- **Foliage**: Semi-evergreen; Lanceolate, inch-long pale green leaves that have a thin creamy-white margin. The new growth on this plant is often upright and then lies down under the weight of the stems and in shade it tends to grow slightly more open and taller.
- **Flower:** Interestingly, it rarely if ever produces flowers, which would be in short panicles of yellow. In shade, the new growth often emerges upright and only lays down after it matures or is trampled into submission by the garden cat.
