Sedum sieboldii

- <u>Use:</u> Fantastic and easy to grow sedum for dry locations. Round clusters of medium-pink florets top the foliage and softly arch over owing to the weight of the flowers. Plants can be tucked here and there, near the edges of sunny gardens, or softly covering the hard edges of a rock wall.
- <u>Exposure/Soil</u>: Full— part sun (but must be 5-6 hours of afternoon sun). Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Use slow release fertilizer two times a year. Do not give too much nitrogen or they will not produce flowers. Once established needs only occasional water.
- Growth: Fast-growing to 4-6". High and trailing 2-3 ft.
- *Hardiness:* Perennial Zone 3-8
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. This Japanese relative is welcome all summer for its radiating 4-6" wands of glaucous-blue, round leaves.
- **Flower:** Blooms in late summer through fall in a blaze of deep pink blossoms.
