Azalea 'Hilda Niblett' (Robin Hill type)

- <u>Use:</u> A low-growing, vigorous, and precocious in bloom!
 Its unique, low-maintenance turtle-shaped habit makes it one of the most exciting Azaleas. More than four decades in the making, Robert Gartrell's large-flowered, evergreen Azaleas extend the Azalea bloom season into late spring and early summer. Robin Hill Azaleas are easy to grow in light to medium shade, and are exceptionally cold-hardy and weather resistant.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Part shade. Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy.
- **Growth**: Never more than 1 foot tall, its growth is vigorous but disciplined, requiring no pruning to maintain its symmetrical shape. With a 3- to 4-foot spread, Hilda Niblett is invaluable as a ground cover or for restricted-space gardens, patio planters or Bonsai training.
- *Hardiness*: 5-8; Shrub
- <u>Foliage</u>: Evergreen; Small, bright green leaves give year-round appeal.
- <u>Flower:</u> It bears soft pink, darker pink, and striped, 4-inch flowers heavily marked with a deeper rose-pink. Variable shades can change slightly over time.
