Buxus microphylla var. japonica = B. sinica var. japonica

- <u>Use:</u> This Korean boxwood cultivar is a dense, compact, many-branched, broad, mounded evergreen shrub which usually has a loose and open habit. An extremely hardy plant that is a good choice for northern climates. Formerly known as and sometimes still sold as Buxus microphylla var. koreana 'Wintergreen'. Stays more reliably green in the winter compared to other boxwoods.
- <u>Exposure/Soil</u>: Prefers full sun to part shade. Keep surface of soil moist, but not soggy.
- **Growth:** Slow annual growth (to 2" in height per year), however height may obviously be controlled by pruning. Typically grown as a 2-4' tall (infrequently larger) shrub with a somewhat larger spread.
- Hardiness: 5-10 Shrub
- *Foliage:* Small, obovate, medium green leaves (to 5/8" long).
- Flower: Not known for flowers.
