Camellia japonica 'Colonial Dame'

- <u>Use:</u> Introduced in 1948 in Thomasville, Georgia. Exquisite! It has an upright to rounded growth habit with large, rich dark green, glossy foliage. Use as a large hedge, garden backdrop, or in large pots until they grow too large.
- <u>Exposure</u>: Prefers sheltered site, prefers a little bit of shade form afternoon sun, and any well drained neutral/ acid soil.
- *Growth:* Moderate growing to 10 to 12 ft. tall and 3 to 10' wide, larger with age.
- *Hardiness: Zone* 7b-9; Shrub
- *Foliage:* Vigorous, compact, upright, evergreen shrub, valued for small pale green foliage.
- <u>Flower</u>: Admired for its white, 4-5" formal double blooms with an occasional blush from December through March. <u>Prune only right after blooms fade.</u>
