They are an outstanding alternative to commonly used species such as cherry laurels, junipers, hollies, Indian hawthorn, and even boxwood.

- <u>Use</u>: Attractive, soft, blue-green fine textured foliage with a compact, rounded habit makes Bayou Bliss a great alternative to Boxwood or Holly. Use in mass plantings, borders or hedges. Formerly know as 'Jewel Box'
- Exposure/Soil: Grows in full to part sun. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry. Will tolerate wet soil.
- <u>Growth</u>: Grows 2-3' tall and 3-4' wide with layered branches are held in graceful, arching sweeps. For a seamless planting, plant them 2-3 feet apart. Otherwise, space them 4-5+ feet apart to leave space between shrubs.
- *Hardiness:* Zone 7a-9b; Shrub
- Foliage: Evergreen; Blue-green cascading foliage on a pest and disease resistant
- <u>Flower:</u> Small reddish / maroon flowers begin to appear in late winter, lasting for several weeks.
