- **Use:** Smooth hydrangeas are beloved for their big, reliable, blooms. But color has never been their strong suit - until now. Invincibelle Mini Mauvette® hydrangea brings a never-before-seen color to the species, with large mophead flowers in a deep mauve-violet. Blooms are held on very strong stems and appear early summer through fall. Dwarf habit gives this native plant amazing versatility in the landscape and the garden.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Plant in a part sun, well-drained spot; some early afternoon shade is beneficial in hot southern regions. Prune in late winter or early spring. Soil pH does not affect flower color.
- **Growth:** It reaches just 2.5-3' tall and wide; naturally grows as a tidy, rounded mound.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 4-8; Shrub
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Coarsely toothed, glossy, dark-green leaves.
- **Flower:** The flowers are a deep pink-mauve, and they're held up on strong, sturdy stems that don't flop. The show begins in early summer and because it is a rebloomer, it continues clear through frost for an endless supply of flowers for the landscape or vase (both fresh and dried!).
