
Invincibelle Sublime Hydrangea

- <u>Use</u>: This beauty ushers in a new day for full-sized smooth hydrangeas, with cloud-like mophead flowers floating above the plant on super-sturdy stems. Very dark green foliage sets off the lively green of the blooms. Makes a fantastic cut flower, both fresh and dried, if you can bring yourself to remove them from the fabulous plant.
- <u>Exposure/Soil</u>: Plant in a part sun, well-drained spot; some early afternoon shade is beneficial in hot southern regions. Prune in late winter or early spring. Soil pH does not affect flower color.
- <u>Growth</u>: Grows 4-5" tall and wide; naturally grows as a tidy, rounded mound.
- *Hardiness:* Zone 3a-9b; Shrub
- *Foliage:* Deciduous. Coarsely toothed, glossy, dark-green leaves.
- <u>Flower:</u> Each floret of the big, fluffy blooms is a deeply saturated tourmaline-green that looks refreshing and intriguing in the garden all summer long. They last clear through frost for a persistent show that takes practically no effort on your part. The strong stems make cutting easy, and the blossoms are a wonder in fresh and dried bouquets.
