## Florida Anise







## Illicium floridanum

- <u>Use:</u> This rapidly growing, evergreen, Florida native shrub has\_olive green leaves and reddish-purple, starry, two-inch flowers. The many slender branches of Florida Anise droop to the ground giving a rounded, open canopy in the shade, ideal for natural settings, or in sunny locations it can be pruned into dense hedges or windbreaks.
- <u>Exposure/Soil</u>: Grows well in sun or shade, but thins out inthe shade.
  Prefers rich soil and ample\_moisture but will easily survive harsher conditions. It is an easy\_to grow, pest-free shrub. Once established it will need watering\_only during long periods of drought and pruning once a year to\_maintain its shrub form.
- **Growth:** Moderate-growing 8-10 ft. tall, 5-6' wide or more.
- Hardiness: 7b-10 Shrub
  - <u>Foliage</u>: Evergreen. The leaves of Florida Anise give off a distinctive odor when bruised or crushed. It can be pruned and trained into a small, multi-trunked or single-trunked tree.
- <u>Flower:</u> The small, somewhat showy, maroon flowers appear in spring and are followed in late summer to fall by star-shaped, many-seeded pods which cling\_to the stems.

Will tolerate damp or dry soils and can be turned into a hedge.
