Gorgeous repeat blooming climbing Rose. Recommended by UGA as a great rose for Georgia!

Rosa 'New Dawn'

- <u>Use</u>: A double-flowered blush pink with bright yellow stamens that is free flowering and sweetly fragrant and reblooms persistently deep into fall. Also disease resistant, especially to black spot, the bane of many Roses here. A great Rose in every respect. Own-root.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full to part sun. They must have well-drained soils, so if you have red clay you must amend it. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry. Keep water off the leaves (no sprinklers/don't water leaves.)
- <u>Growth</u>: It can be grown as a climber; trained against a wall, up a pillar or through an obelisk; or even grown as a tall hedge. Left alone, it grows to about 8 feet high by 8 feet wide.
- Hardiness: 5-10 Climber or Shrub
- Foliage: Deciduous.
- Flower: Large, fragrant, powder pink flowers from late spring to fall.
