Viburnum macrosepalum sterile

- <u>Use</u>: Want a spring showstopper for your yard? This hardy and carefree shrub has been popular for many generations. You may have seen it in your mother's garden or close to grandma's front door. Regardless of where you've seen it, it probably left a lasting impression.
- <u>Exposure/Soil</u>: Full to part sun. Requires well-drained soil and good moisture.
- <u>Growth</u>: 12 feet tall and wide; can be cut back every three to four years to 2' to 3' to control size if necessary, although bloom for the following year will be lost.
- Hardiness: 4-8 Shrub
- **Foliage:** Dull green, oval to oblong, 2-4 inches long, 1 ½ to 2 ½ inches wide. Foliage can be semi-evergreen in the South.
- Flower: From April into May you'll be rewarded with spectacular, soft-ball-size blooms. These flowers start out lime green and then open to pristine white. Because the blooms are sterile, this viburnum does not produce fruit. Most years they will rebloom again in the fall for a few months as well. Flowers may start flat and then emerge ball shaped.
