Brandywine (Possumhaw) Viburnum





Viburnum nudum 'Brandywine'

- <u>Use</u>: Experience the most beautiful berry display in the plant kingdom with this new Viburnum. It is native to low woods, swamps and bogs in the eastern and southeastern U.S. from Connecticut south to Florida and Louisiana.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full to part sun(best) to shade. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry. Tolerant of all soils and positions as long as it is not too dry.
- Growth: Quickly growing to 5-6' tall and 5-6' wide.
- *Hardiness:* Zone 5-8; Shrub
- <u>Foliage</u>: Deciduous. Showy glossy leaves change to incredible dark maroon-red in autumn.
- <u>Flower:</u> It features aromatic white flowers arranged in flat-topped clusters (cymes 2-5" wide) in May-June. It delivers loads of breath-taking berries that transform from green to shades of vivid pink and blue. A great companion pollinator for 'Winterthur' although Brandywine has good berry production even without another pollinator nearby. The berries are highly acidic but edible. Beloved by wildlife.
