## Blue Deodar Cedar



Great focal point and specimen in parks and large gardens. Give this tree plenty of room to spread as it will be the dominant feature in the landscape.



## Cedrus deodara 'Blue Seedling'

- <u>Use</u>: Large, pyramidal form with attractive gray green foliage and graceful, arching branches. Makes a wonderful living Christmas tree! Allow plenty of room in the landscape to best display this stately tree. Heat and drought tolerant when established.
- Exposure/Soil: Full to part sun. Follow a regular watering schedule during the first growing season to establish a deep, extensive root system. Watering can be reduced after establishment. Feed with a general purpose fertilizer before new growth begins in spring. Pruning time: winter.
- **Growth:** To 40 to 50 ft. tall and 20 to 30 ft. wide. In their native range, to 150 ft. tall over 100 years.
- Hardiness: Zone 7-11; Tree
- <u>Foliage</u>: Evergreen. Blue branchlets are densely pubescent and droop downward at the tips. The stiff, needle-like leaves are about 2 in (5.1 cm) long and borne in dense whorls of 20-30 per cluster.
- **Flower:** Produces 3 to 4" bluish green cones on female trees.
