Fall variety ripens early October. Does not color well, but quality is superb. Good for cooking, eating and baking.

Malus pumila 'Red Fuji'

- <u>Use</u>: Please be sure to read the Home Garden Apples article from UGA on our Plant Information Page on the website. There is too much information to print here. You need a pollinator tree.
- <u>Exposure/Soil</u>: Sunlight, and plenty of it, is a key to increasing fruit production. Pick an area where the trees will be in the sun most or all of the day. The early morning sun is particularly important because it dries the dew from the leaves thereby reducing the incidence of diseases. If the planting site does not get plenty of sun, then you can't expect the best performance from the tree. Well-drained, rich soil. pH of 5.5 to 6.5 necessary.
- Growth: Mature height 18-20 ft. Plant at 25 ft apart.
- Hardiness: 6-10; Tree.
- Foliage: Deciduous. Green leaves.
- Flower/ Fruit: Fuji apples are one of the most recent apple varieties to take the world by storm. Large striped red and green apples, with crisp flesh. Pollination. Code B
