
Belle of Georgia Peach Tree

Prunus persica 'Belle of Georgia'

- <u>Use</u>: Georgia Belle is also known as Belle of Georgia. It is an old-time favorite with large, white fruit with a reddish blush. The flesh is white and creamy with tinges of red. Although firm, it bruises easily. It is highly flavored and aromatic. Good for all uses. It is freestone. Ripens a few days before Elberta, late in the season. It is a hardy and reliable producer that is self-fertile.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full to part sun. Soil should be well-drained. Acidic soil is preferred, though it can tolerate a wide variety of soils. They are not drought-tolerant, so proper watering is a must.
- *Growth:* Grows 10-15' tall and wide.
- *Hardiness:* Zone 5-8; Tree
- Foliage: Deciduous. Dark green leaves.
- <u>Flower:</u> Large fruit with brilliant red flowering. Very firm and highly flavored. White flesh, freestone. Fruit trees need a minimum of 6-8 hours of sunlight daily and regular water. (Selfpollinating)
