firm, sweet and freestone with a great quality and taste. Ripens from July to August, 2-3 harvests can be expected because the fruits do not mature at the same time.

Prunus persica 'Redhaven'

- <u>Use</u>: An excellent freestone peach with red-blushed, yellow skin and firm, sweet, yellow flesh. Ideal for fresh eating, canning and freezing. An attractive tree, with dark pink buds that open to fragrant, pink flowers in spring. Self-fertile, but more fruit when planted near another variety. Recommended chill: 800 - 900 hours.
- <u>Exposure/Soil</u>: Full to part sun. Soil should be well-drained. Acidic soil is preferred, though it can tolerate a wide variety of soils. They are not drought-tolerant, so proper watering is a must.
- **Growth:** Grows 20 to 25 ft. tall and wide; easily kept smaller with annual pruning.
- *Hardiness:* Zone 5-8; Tree
- Foliage: Deciduous. Dark green leaves. Fall foliage is a bright gold.
- <u>Flower:</u> Fragrant, showy flowers. This is a heavy-bearing cultivar with little maintenance, easy to grow. It has a spreading characteristic in branches. The size of the tree depends on the version you choose, standard or dwarf. It is resistant to leaf-spot and self-pollinating.
