 Known for producing delicious, bright yellow pears for fresh eating as well as desserts, preserves and honey.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Full to part sun. Soil should be well-drained. Acidic soil is preferred, though it can tolerate a wide variety of soils.
- As long as it is properly established, it is moderately drought tolerant.
- <u>Growth</u>: The fast growing Keiffer reaches a mature height of 15-25 feet quickly. It's rounded habit and glossy green leaves make it exceptional as a landscape tree, as well as for producing flavorful fruit. It is known for its hardiness and long life span, tolerating hot climates and drought.
- *Hardiness:* Zone 4-9; Tree
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. Features attractive, dark red leaves which hold their color throughout the growing season.
- <u>Flower:</u> The perfect pear for canning and preserves. Pick your pears when still firm and yellow-green in color.
