## Asiatic Jasmine





Trachelospermum asiaticum

- <u>Use:</u> Asiatic jasmine is a true ground cover; its numerous prostrate stems and leaves eventually blanket the ground, forming a thick mat that inhibits weeds. The first year it sleeps, second year it creeps and the third year it leaps. Can also be grown in a container and mixed with flowering plants.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Part sun /shade, but prefers part sun; well-draining soil and appreciates slow release fertilizer. Water when top 3 in of soil is dry. Has been grown in full sun, but may burn a little in the summer and needs more water.
- <u>Growth</u>: Moderate growth with a height 6" and will continue to grow outward. Plant 1-2' apart. Can also be trained to climb 8-10 feet, blooms best when climbing in a sunny or partially-sunny location (smaller or non-existant blooms when prostrate and/or in less sun).
- Hardiness: 7-9; Vine
- <u>Foliage</u>: Glossy evergreen leaves.
- <u>Flowers:</u> Small white slightly fragrant flowers may emerge, but not always reliable bloomer.
