

Beaujolais Premium Coral Bells



Heuchera villosa 'Beaujolais'

The colorful foliage pairs well with Hostas, Hellebore, or Hardy Ferns. Use as a foreground planting to Hydrangeas or other tall growing Shrubs. Stunning when used as a Groundcover or edging lining a shaded pathway.

- **Use:** Coral bells are easy to grow and blend easily with most other perennials in the landscape. Because of their low, mounding habit, they are often used as edging along paths or in containers. Try cutting a few of the tall flower scapes for fresh bouquets
- **Exposure/Soil:** Part sun-shade. Best when planted under other trees, but not too deep a shade or poor flowering and leaf color. Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Use slow release fertilizer two times a year. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry.
- **Growth:** Fast growth to 16-18 "tall, 24" in bloom overall, by 12-18" wide.
- **Hardiness:** 5-8; Perennial
- **Foliage:** Semi-evergreen. Huge burgundy leaves with a touch of silver, heavily veined in deep violet.
- **Flower:** Cream-colored, bell-shaped blooms rise above height given: up to 16" in the summer.
