

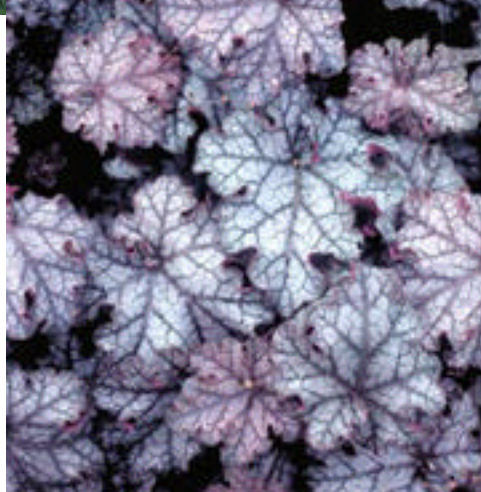
Can Can Coral Bells



Heuchera x 'Can Can'

- **Use:** This beauty bears small blush-white flowers on leafless stalks atop a tight mound of ruffled, metallic-silver leaves. While this sun-and-shade tolerant perennial is grown primarily for its semievergreen foliage, its spikes of flowers are excellent for cutting.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Part sun-shade. Best when planted under other trees, but not too deep a shade or poor flowering and leaf color. Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Use slow release fertilizer two times a year. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry.
- **Growth:** Fast growth to 16-18 "tall, 24" in bloom overall, by 12-18" wide.
- **Hardiness:** 5-8; Perennial
- **Foliage:** Semi-evergreen. The leaves are almost flirtatious, showing glimpses of their beet-red backsides underneath their ruffled edges. Their upper surfaces are frosted silver pink with dark venation and dark margins.
- **Flower:** In the summer it produces light, airy panicles of greenish-white flowers in upright spires above the leaves.

This amazing plant has wavy leaves and strong silver veils over dark foliage making this in-



teresting *Heuchera* a winner.
