

Regina Coral Bells



Vigorous and large flowered, these varieties make excellent border plants with their nearly evergreen foliage in neat clumps.

- **Use:** As a group, the Hybrid Coral Bells offer the gardener a tremendous new range of foliage colours, especially for shady areas. A prize winner. A recent introduction and a great improvement. A supreme accent for small space gardens. Mass for a powerful sea of purple or mix with other green leaf coral bells or Tiarellas for variety. The perfect plant to inject vitality into pots and baskets.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Part sun-shade. Best when planted under other trees, but not too deep a shade or poor flowering and leaf color. Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Use slow release fertilizer two times a year. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry.
- **Growth:** Fast growth to 20-30 "tall, 36" in bloom overall, by 12" wide.
- **Hardiness:** 5-8; Perennial
- **Foliage:** Semi-evergreen. Silvered burgundy-bronze leaves.
- **Flower:** Light pink flowers late spring into summer.
