

Tiramisu Premium Coral Bells

Heuchera x 'Tiramisu'

- **Use:** Another new exotic heuchera from France that offers a rainbow of colors that change with the seasons. In the spring, the young leaves emerge bright yellow with brick red centers that radiate out through the veining of the leaf. By mid summer, the leaves lighten to a chartreuse coloring that is frosted in silver and topped with airy stems of creamy-white flowers. When autumn arrives, the brick red coloration returns and covers the entire leaf, except for a bright chartreuse margin that highlights the red color! Thrives in heat and humidity and is destined to become one of the best new perennials on the market!
- **Exposure/Soil:** Part sun-shade. Best when planted under other trees, but not too deep a shade or poor flowering and leaf color. Moist, well-drained soil, but not soggy. Use slow release fertilizer two times a year. Water regularly, when top 3 in. of soil is dry.
- **Growth:** Fast growth to 8-10 "tall, 16" in bloom overall, by 10-12" wide.
- **Hardiness:** 4-9; Perennial
- **Foliage:** Semi-evergreen. In both spring and fall, the chartreuse foliage has a heavy smattering of brick red coloration that radiates out from the midrib of each leaf. During the summer, the leaves lighten to chartreuse and develop a light silver overlay.
- **Flower:** Pale flower spikes stand above the foliage in summer.
