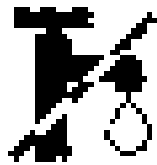


# Lavender Queen Siberian Iris



## *Iris siberica* 'Lavender Queen'

- **Use:** Excellent for use in borders. Their thick roots drive down deeply, which makes them drought resistant (though they also thrive in damp soil) and great plants for holding steep banks in place. Each clump becomes huge, and when a group of them grows together, weeds can't grow in between.
- **Exposure/Soil:** Plant in full sun to partial shade, in fertile well drained soil. Use slow release fertilizer two times a year.
- **Growth:** Grows 30" tall. Divide every 3-4 years. Space new container grown plants 18" - 36" apart.
- **Hardiness:** Zone 5-8 Perennial
- **Foliage:** Deciduous. After bloom, the grassy leaves stand erect and green through the growing season.
- **Flower:** A dark lavender-red blossom midseason.
